Dahlias

40. Dahlias, one vase or bowl, bowl not to exceed 300mm in diameter
41. 1 bloom, between 220mm - 260mm
42. Dahlias, one vase, three cactus or semi cactus, medium not exceeding 220mm
43. Dahlias, one vase, five blooms, pompon, not exceeding 52mm
44. For those who have not won a prize for dahlias (novices). One vase, three stems. (Cup presented to first prize winner, provided winner is a Member)

Roses

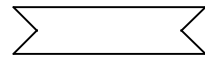
45. Roses, large flowered, one vase, three stems
46. Roses, large flowered, one vase, one specimen bloom
47. Roses, cluster flowered, one spray

General

48. Vase of mixed flowers
49. Vase of foliage (with or without berries)

Definitions:

A bowl is wider than it is high



A vase is higher than it is wide



FRUIT

50. Apples, cooking, three
51. Apples, dessert, three
52. Pears, dessert, three
53. Blackberries, dish of twelve with stalks
54. Plums, six
55. Raspberries, dish of twelve with stalks
56. Any other fruit not listed above (max. six of same variety)

VEGETABLES

57. Potatoes, white, four
58. Potatoes, other than white, four
59. Carrots, three (with at least 50mm of top)
60. Runner beans, nine pods with stalks

Conversions:

1 inch = 25.4 mm exactly

50 mm = 2 in
75 mm = 3 in

Access by car - Parking

Exhibitors may park their cars in the Yard (off Dukes Avenue, the entrance to Chiswick House and gardens before the public parking area) but must move them, after setting up, to the public car park.

Setting up : 10.30am - 12.00pm

Setting up will be at the Duke's Avenue end of the Camellia House. Exhibitors should pay for their entries and pick up their show cards there. In the same area there will be, as usual, tables, water, vases and plates available until 12.00pm sharp when judging will commence.

Exhibits should be placed with the card on the appropriate section of the Camellia House shelves, which will be numbered in the usual way and marked with dividers. There will be people around to help.

The Camellia House will be open from 2.00pm after judging, until 3.30pm.

Prizes will be presented in the central area (rotunda) of the Camellia House at 3.30pm and any exhibitors who want to keep their flowers or produce must remove them by 4.00pm.
