FLOWERS

Roses

1. A bowl of roses for all-round effect, bowl not to exceed 300mm in diameter
2. Rose, large flowered, one bloom
3. Roses, cluster flowered, three stems, one variety
4. For those who have not won a prize for roses (novices). One vase, three stems, any varieties

Sweet Peas

5. Sweet peas, one vase, five stems, one cultivar
6. Sweet peas, one vase, five stems, mixed
7. For those who have not won a prize for sweet peas (novices). Sweet peas, one vase, five stems, mixed

Other Flowers

8. Delphinium, one spike
9. Lilies, one stem

FRUIT

10. Strawberries, dish of nine with stalks
11. Gooseberries, dish of twelve with stalks
12. Raspberries, dish of twelve with stalks
13. Currants (black, red or white), seven strigs with fruit attached
14. Any other fruit not listed above (max. 9 of same variety)

VEGETABLES

15. Lettuces, cos, two (with washed roots)
16. Any other variety of lettuce, two (with washed roots)
17. Broad beans, five
18. Rhubarb, five sticks, with 50 - 75mm of leaf

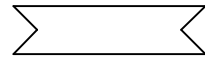
CHILDREN

Primary School Age - to be stated on entry

19. A collection of 3 different salad vegetables you have grown
20. A moss or miniature garden on a tray/plate (not exceeding 300mm diameter or 300mm x 300mm)
21. A drawing of a plant (tree, flower or vegetable) named
22. A horticultural photograph (colour or b/w)
23. An edible necklace
24. Your initials grown in mustard and cress

Definitions:

A bowl is wider than it is high



A vase is higher than it is wide



Conversions:

1 inch = 25.4 mm exactly

Approximately, for guidance:

50 mm = 2 in
75 mm = 3 in
100 mm = 4 in
125 mm = 5 in
150 mm = 6 in
175 mm = 7 in
200 mm = 8 in
300 mm = 12 in
600 mm = 24 in
900 mm = 36 in

Pot and bowl diameters are measured inside the pot

A strig is a stem or stalk, so the currants are attached rather like a truss of cherry tomatoes
